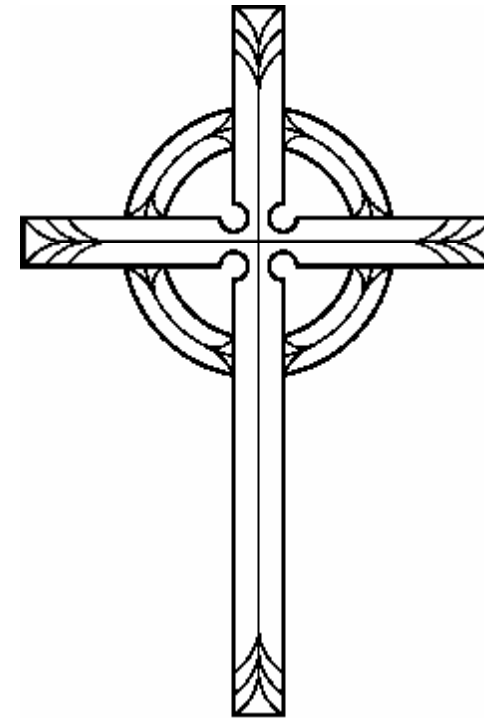

On July 28-31, 86 young musicians from around the Midwestern United States will be performing at Hill Auditorium in Ann Arbor as members of the Blue Lake Fine Arts Camp International Youth Symphony Orchestra (IYSO). We are in need of families who are willing to serve as a host family for one or two students (or more, if you are so inclined!).

Blue Lake Fine Arts Camp's International Program, established in 1969, is dedicated to promoting peace and understanding through the universal language of the arts. Since its inception, nearly 30,000 young European, Asian, and American artists have exchanged performances and experienced the love, wonder, and excitement of living with host families in a foreign land. More than 110,000 families in Europe and America have provided generous hospitality for the participants. Countless concert-goers on both continents have also been touched by these goodwill ambassadors.

FACT: Over the past 10 years, Burma's army has destroyed more than 3,000 villages. As a result, an estimated 500,000 ethnic civilians currently are internally displaced in eastern Burma, and there are believed to be more than 2.5 million civilians from Burma, including migrant workers and refugees, in Thailand.
