## New Season of Adult Christian Education

With the beginning of the new year, First Baptist Church is offering two new learning opportunities for adults during our Christian Education hour each Sunday from 11:30-12:30. The two course offerings reflect a larger design for Sunday adult education in 2017 and perhaps beyond. The plan is to offer two class options throughout the year: one of them a study of scripture, the other a study on other topics related to spirituality, ethics, history, theology, social concerns, etc. The two courses will be scheduled for the same number of weeks, so that the beginning and ending will correspond and people can choose either new course when the previous courses conclude.

Scheduled for January 8 - February 26, the two classes will be:

### 1. *Simply Jesus*

This class will re-examine Gospel texts and the historical setting of Judaism in Jesus time in order to gain better understanding of his proclamation, ministry, and identity. This study will draw from the insights of N. T. Wright's book, *Simply Jesus: A New Vision of Who He Was, What He Did, and Why He Matters*. Leader: Joe Mortensen

### 2. *How to Pray: A (Re-)Introduction to the Ongoing Practice of Prayer*

This class will include pragmatic discussions of the basics of daily prayer. Guidance and rationale will be offered on the foundational elements of prayer and on different approaches and models for how it is done. This course is for beginners and for those who wish to renew and strengthen their practice of prayer. Leader: Paul Simpson Duke

### Director of Children's Ministries

The First Baptist Church of Ann Arbor seeks an enthusiastic and creative individual for a part-time Director of Children's Ministries position. This 15- to 20-hour position will oversee many facets of Christian education and focus on children from infancy through 6<sup>th</sup> grade.

#### Responsibilities:

- leading and nurturing children toward Christian faith and discipleship by providing opportunities to study, worship, serve, build community, and grow spiritually;
- developing and implementing sound and innovative educational programs that foster spiritual development and promote Bible fluency;
- teaching children on Sunday mornings and at other times as scheduled;
- training and scheduling teachers and nursery caregivers;
- coordinating children's events and selected outreach programs;
- developing a strong relationship and communicating with families with children both within the congregation and in the wider community.
- working with the Board of Christian Education and Church staff.

#### Qualifications:

A Bachelor's degree in a related field and teaching experience are required. The successful candidate will possess strong oral and written communication skills and be a self-motivated leader able to work well with a variety of groups, including children and their families, volunteers, and church staff. A healthy personal spiritual life and a theology consistent with the pastoral ministries of First Baptist Church of Ann Arbor and supportive of American Baptist Churches USA tradition are essential.

Anticipated hours are 15-20 hours weekly, including Sunday mornings. Salary will be commensurate with experience.
