Children and Youth are an important part of our life together at First Baptist Church. All children are welcome in worship. Worshipful Play Bags are available as you enter the sanctuary. Nursery care is available for children (infant through 3 yrs) on the top floor. Children (through 5th grade) leave for Church School following Time as Children.

Following worship, children (Young 5s-K) have Children's Choir with Coley Roberts and younger children (birth-4s) are invited to have supervised time in our play space. Care is provided for children until 12:30p when 2nd Hour classes for adults and teens wrap up. Please pick up your kids in the play space on the top floor. Youth (grades 6-12) are invited to join adults for Fellowship Time following worship and then head down to the Youth Room (directly underneath the Sanctuary) for Youth Group, 11:30a- 12:30p. Parenting as a Spiritual Journey Book Group. We gather in the Children's Ministry wing living room following fellowship time (11:30-12:30p) to discuss *Parenting as a Spiritual Journey* by Rabbi Nancy Fuchs- Kreimer. Kids will be engaged with Children's Choir and supervised play during this time. You are welcome to join the discussion any and all weeks as you are able.

Sermon Discussion and Group Sharing. Sundays, 11:30a-12:30p. Dick Bowser will lead the conversation today on the themes, questions, implications, and possible applications of the sermon just preached in the Sunday service. It's a free-flowing discussion in which all ideas, perspectives, questions, and concerns are welcome. Opportunity is also given each week for participants to offer personal sharing if they wish, so that we can know and support each other better. Join us in the Memorial Lounge for this time of thoughtful discussion and connection.

Our AD LIBITUM Concert Series resumes in March with two inspiring concerts. "Deep in Thoughts" this coming Tuesday, March 14 at noon is a meditative concert. Shin-Ae Chun will perform organ music written by Herbert Howell, J.S. Bach, Frescobaldi, Max Reger, Maurice Duruflé and others. Alice Van Wambeke (harpsichord), Phoebe Gelzer-Govatos (violin) and Shin-Ae Chun (organ and harpsichord) will perform in several different musical settings.
