Our organist, **Dr. Shin-Ae Chun**, is on leave. We welcome **Gale Kramer** to the organ this morning. Gale Kramer retired in 2007 after thirty years as organist of the Rice Memorial Organ at Metropolitan Methodist Church in Detroit. During fifteen years of that time, he was the organist for Temple Beth El in Bloomfield Hills. Before that, he served nine years as organist of Ann Arbor's First Congregational Church.

A note on the prelude: "We now implore the Holy Spirit for, above all, a right faith, that it may preserve us at our end when we go home from this exile." The first stanza of *Nun bitten wir den heiligen Geist* dates from the 13th century. Martin Luther added three stanzas addressing the Holy Spirit and these appeared in one of the earliest Protestant hymnbooks, published by his contemporary Johann Walther. The composer of today's setting was another J G Walther who was a contemporary of Bach.

On most Sundays following worship, children (Young 5s-5th grade) have Children's Choir with Coley Roberts and younger children (birth-4s) are invited to have supervised time in our play space. Care is provided for children until 12:30. Youth (grades 6-12) are invited to join adults for Fellowship Time following worship and then head down to the Youth Room (directly underneath the Sanctuary) for Youth Group, 11:30a-12:30p. **This Sunday, our programming after worship is on pause for the holiday weekend**. Our Adult Spiritual Formation series is "Journeys Worth Sharing." On Sundays through June 4 (with the exception of the Memorial Day weekend), some members of our congregations will share stories of their own faith experience.
