Back-to-School Supplies for Community Action Network (CAN). For many, many years our congregation has provided backpacks filled with school supplies as well as miscellaneous supplies so the children served at the seven CAN sites will start the new school year prepared. The staff at CAN have adjusted their method of collecting this year, to better meet the growing demand.

We hope our congregation will continue to generously provide for the children and youth of CAN. We offer two methods. 1) simply visit the Amazon registry using the link on our website (fbca2.org/connect) and select the items you wish to contribute. When you checkout, select the address associated with the Registry (809 Taylor St., Ann Arbor, MI 48105). The items will get shipped right to CAN where they will be sorted and delivered to each site in time for our Back-to-School events in mid-August; and 2) as in previous years, you may also make a financial donation and let us do the shopping. Sue Ellen will accept donations until August 1 and then apply those donations to the Amazon registry.

For the past 40 years, Hope Clinic has been serving those in need in our community. We are wrapping up our collection for the clinic pantry next Sunday, July 30. We are looking for kidfriendly foods, but all non-perishable food items are gladly accepted.
