
Dear Church Family,



2024 Budget Proposal Increases


Adding \$5,000 to support a youth service learning trip to our ministry partners, AMOS Health and Hope in Nicaragua (pre-pandemic level)

October 27, 2023 Friday at Noon House by the Side of the Road needs volunteers! The mission of House by the Side of the Road is to provide FREE clothing and small household items to children and adults in need in Washtenaw County. We opened our doors in 1970 as a partnership between churches in the area and the Washtenaw County Board of Commissioners, with First Baptist Church of Ann Arbor being a Founding Church. We serve those who are homeless, reentering society from prison, those with mental health issues, immigrants, migrant workers, and others. People come to us after family breakup, job loss, fire, or prolonged illness.

Volunteers are crucial to what we do. We are a 100% volunteer organization. We have NO paid staff. We rely on the generosity and participation of many individuals and organizations. We need people to receive, sort, tag, and hang up clothes, sort and display household items, or check clients in and out. We are open for clients from 10am to 2pm weekdays. We prefer volunteers who can work a regular shift between 9:30am and 3pm those days or on the one Saturday a month volunteers work to catch up with the large number of donations we receive.

We are on pace to serve the largest number of clients in our history. This is a great opportunity for individual volunteers or groups to make a positive impact on Washtenaw County.
