Rick has served as interim minister of three congregations, currently serves as Affiliate Professor of Pastoral Care at Berkeley School of Theology and is an emeritus board member of the Association of Welcoming and Affirming Baptists. Sunday Parking in the Structure. Beginning June 2nd and continuing each Sunday the city public parking facilities have made an operational change to lower structure and lot gate arms on Sundays. *Parking will still be free on Sundays*, but the gates will be down, and parking patrons will need to pull a ticket to enter the facility. When exiting parking patrons will simply insert their parking ticket into the in-lane exit equipment and the gate will go up. If the ticket is lost, a replacement fee will be imposed.
