Favorite thing since 2020 has been teaching a spiritual care elective for 3rd and 4th yr medical students... Loved learning about religion, going deep into biblical history and interpretation in college. Went to div school with the intention of being an academic or working in nonprofits. interim minister of three congregations, currently serves as Affiliate Professor of Pastoral Care at Berkeley School of Theology and is an emeritus board member of the Association of Welcoming and Affirming Baptists.
