- Avalon Housing is currently supporting 14 Washtenaw County tenants who have been displaced and are currently in a hotel for the next 6 months due to fire damage in their building. The tenants are safe and okay, but repairs must be done to the building before they can return to their respective homes. The tenants no longer have access to food pantries and laundry facilities. Therefore, the Mission Action Board is challenging our church to help support these 14 tenants by providing Meijer gift cards, cash for laundry services, or checks made out to the church with "Avalon Housing" in the memo line.
