The Pastor Search Committee (PSC) met on Monday, July 14. We focused our time on developing an interview strategy. This includes deciding on the stages of interviewing and the ways we find most effective to interact with applicants. We are in the process of creating screening rubrics and interview questions. We anticipate this will require a few more meetings to complete. We feel God's leading and the hope that many excellent candidates will apply compelled by all that FBCA2 has to offer.

The PSC is committed to moving this process forward and will be working even when PSC members are on vacation this summer. We trust that our denominational representative will have the position posted with American Baptist Churches soon. Our goal is to begin reviewing applicants around the middle of August.
