Dear Friends,

She has gone on to become the creator of many hymns, songs, and works on worship. The hymn for Sunday is probably my favorite of hers, "Oh for a world preparing for God's glorious reign of peace." The texts are from Isaiah and Romans. What would it mean for us to dream such a world and then live to make the dream come true?

As the season changes, I look forward to witnessing, worshiping, and working with you all for the good of the First Baptist community and the building up of God's Beloved Community.

CHILDREN'S CHOIR



Children's Choir for kids in Young 5's through 5th grade begins Sunday, September 14th! Michelle Ding and Charlie Duke look forward to meeting with the children each Sunday from 11:30-12:00p in the Children's Choir room in the Children's Ministry wing. Kids may be picked up from the choir room at noon or they can head to our supervised Play Space until 12:30 when adult and teen formation classes end (12:30p). We are looking forward to a year of fun faith formation through song!



New Offering - Evening Scripture Study! This fall the church will offer a Bible study on Wednesday evenings from 7 to 8 PM. The study will focus on the book of Genesis and follow the Yale Bible Study curriculum. A key feature of this Bible study is that participants will be asked to read and reflect on the assigned readings in advance of each meeting. Weekly meetings will be devoted to discussing the week's scripture passages and associated material from the Yale curriculum. Most weeks the readings will take 1-2 hours.

Participants are asked to commit to attending most, if not all, weekly meetings, which will be facilitated by Clay Scott. The first meeting will take place on September 17 and the final meeting will take place on November 12. There will be no meeting on October 8. Meetings will be in-person at FBC by default, though some could be switched to virtual depending on group preferences. Come One, Come All! The choir has openings for singers in every section. We have wonderful singers with us now, but we need to build each of our sections, soprano, alto, tenor, and bass. We have section leaders to help you learn your parts too! If you love to sing, or know anyone who does, can read some music (don't need to be an expert), want to worship God through music, desire to help the congregation sing the hymns more fully, and have lots of fun, you could be in the choir! I will admit it takes commitment though, but don't we want to give our best in the worship of the living God? We rehearse together each Thursday night from 7pm to 8:30pm. We sing around 120 pieces per season. We rehearse on Sunday mornings starting at 9:15am until the end of the worship service at 11:15am. We sing the Christmas Eve Festival of Lessons and Carols Service from King's College, Cambridge. If you or anyone you know would like to join us, please let me know, come to a practice, see how you do, experience singing in the choir! You might find you love it and think, "why have I waited so long? This is GREAT!" You can see me on any Sunday after worship if you would like to chat about it! Think about it. Pray about it. Board of Christian Education Updates

The Board of Christian Education is happy to provide our church family with an update of our current work! We are Toni Burton, Theodora Danciu, Robbie Stapleton, David Suell, Marissa Alaniz, Jillian Mast, and Xan Morgan. We meet every month, and we are excited to report that we are busily engaged in all aspects of our constitutionally mandated mission.

This fall we are preparing for a full set of educational programs for children, youth, and adults. The Children's Ministry Team, led by Xan, will continue to offer opportunities for the children (through 5th grade) to listen and respond to God's love through exploration of Bible stories together. We love to have our 2nd-5th graders stay with us in worship every first Sunday of the month. We're delighted to have Lindsay Duke as our new Childcare Supervisor in the Nursery.

The youth, led by Jillian Mast and supported by her Youth Ministry Team, will explore questions of how our faith and traditions help us navigate everyday challenges and enjoy several fun, service-oriented outings together, including The CROP Walk in October.

The Gathering will begin to meet on Wednesday, September 3 at 6:00 PM. This year the group will be guided by Pastor Rick Mixon and Phil Christman. The gathering for college and university students traditionally includes a meal, community building and conversation.

Rick leads our Adult Formation efforts. Classes will begin on Sunday, September 14 with projected study of Walter Brueggeman's Sabbath as Resistance, Christian nationalism and climate concerns. In addition, BCE will partner with Mission Action to introduce an Adult Formation program that includes hearing and learning from a different Mission Partner every fourth Sunday.

Pastor Rick will also lead Bible study beginning Wednesday, September 3 at 1:00 PM in the Campus Center Living Room. This Bible study focuses on the lectionary readings for 10 days out in preparation for worship that Sunday.

Hi Friends,

I am working at a local nonprofit called <u>Garrett's Space</u> and invite you to join us for our annual fundraising event, Go4GarrettsSpace, to learn more about our mission and vision!

Garrett's Space was founded in 2018 by Julie and Scott Halpert after losing their 23-year-old son Garrett to suicide. We are building a non-medical residential campus for young adults ages 18 to 28 who are struggling with depression or anxiety. Currently under construction off of Dixboro Rd. in Superior Township, the campus is slated to open for day programming in late 2026 and 30-day overnight stays beginning in late 2027. WDIV Local 4 did a great feature on our groundbreaking earlier this year if you are interested in learning more.

I had dozens of mutual friends with Garrett and have kept a pulse on Garrett's Space's growth and activities for several years. In January, I was hired as their first-ever Director of Development, and in April, we hired an amazing Executive Director, Dave Garcia, with a background in nonprofit leadership at YMCA adventure camps and LGBTQ+ advocacy organizations. Working as a core team of three full-time staff and a handful of social workers who are already facilitating three peer support groups for young adults, we are excited to continue to build out this organization that we hope serves as a pillar in our

community and supports young people for generations to come.

Our fundraising event is this of Saturday, August 23rd at WCC's Morris Lawrence Building, and I would love it if we could get a church presence there! Guests will enjoy a light dinner, drinks, a silent auction, and a program with updates from Garrett's Space. Tickets are priced at \$75/adult, \$25/young adults, and \$10/children but are available on a sliding scale, as all are welcome to attend. To buy tickets or learn more about the event, click here! 
