

Adult Formation Classes on Sundays at 11:30 in the Memorial Lounge. Today, Pastor Rick continues a discussion on *Sabbath as Resistance: Saying No to the Culture of Now*, by Walter Brueggemann.

Starting November 2, Christians Ruminating on Climate Change: Knowing, Engaging, Coping. For the first three weekends of November, the second hour in the Memorial Room will be devoted to conversations on climate change. Rolf Bouma, who teaches environmental ethics and ecology/religion classes at the University of Michigan, will lead the sessions. The first session will be *Beyond the Bare Facts of Climate Change*, highlighting the range of changes and effects that can be expected as time goes on. The second session will be *Do We Have To Talk About This?*, exploring the challenges of conversations with friends, relatives, and others about climate change. The third session is entitled *Years To Go: Coping with a Changing Climate* and will look at how to live well (for us and others) as the world's climate changes.

Sunday, November 2 is All Saints Sunday. Everyone is invited to participate in creating in the sanctuary a space for remembering. If you have a photograph or a small object to remember someone who has died, please bring it to the church on Sunday October 26 or November 2 for inclusion in the space of remembrance. Place be sure to label your photo or object.

Wednesday Bible Study. The group meets on Wednesdays from 1:00 - 2:00 pm in the memorial lounge with Pastor Rick. On October 22, we will be discussing the texts for November 2. These are Daniel 7:1-3, 15-18; Psalm 149; Ephesians 1:11-12; and Luke 6:20-31.

Wednesday Evening Scripture Study. You are welcome to join us on Wednesday evenings from 7 to 8 PM as we work through the Yale Bible Study curriculum on the book of Genesis. A key feature of this Bible study is that participants will be asked to read and reflect on the assigned readings in advance of each meeting. Weekly meetings will be devoted to discussing the week's scripture passages and associated material from the Yale curriculum. Most weeks the readings will take 1-2 hours. The study will conclude the week before Thanksgiving. If you are interested, please contact the church office.
