

We welcome Rev. William (Bill) Foster to the pulpit this morning. Bill Foster is retired as the former Vice President of Spiritual Care with Trinity Health of Livonia, Michigan. Prior to that, Bill was Director and Regional Director of Spiritual Care for Trinity Health Southeast Michigan. He founded the CPE program accredited at St. Joseph Mercy Ann Arbor (now Trinity Health Ann Arbor). A board-certified chaplain, Bill is an ACPE Certified Educator ("CE"). He is an ordained minister and endorsed chaplain and chaplain educator with the American Baptist Churches, U.S.A. Bill is married to the Rev. Elizabeth (Beth) Jordan Foster. They have a daughter, Hannah, and a son, Nick, a daughter-in-law, Anisa, and grandchildren, Liam, Owen, and Audrey. Bill will also be preaching next Sunday!

Children's Ministry. All children are welcome in worship; Worshipful Play Bags are available as you enter the sanctuary. Nursery care is available for children (infant - 3 years). Children through 5th grade leave for Children's Ministry following Time as Children. Children's Choir (PreK-5th grade) meets from 11:30-noon. You may pick up your children at 11:30 from their Church School classrooms, at 12:00 from the choir room, or at 12:30 when our formation hour ends.

On the first Sunday of each month it's "S3 - Stay for the Service Sunday" when the 2nd-5th grade class will stay in worship for the whole service. This gives the kids an opportunity to experience and participate in the second half of worship. This is a valuable step in their faith formation as worshipers! They are invited to sit with Xan and their classmates during worship. Following worship, the 2nd-5th graders will attend Fellowship Time with their families until Children's Choir begins at 11:30.

The Youth Group for students in grades 6-12. Join us in the Youth Room (in the library wing below the sanctuary) from 11:30-12:30 for snacks, games, and meaningful discussion. This fall we will focus on the subjects of hospitality, emotions, relationships, and justice in the Bible and our Christian faith. We will also have some fun afternoon/evening weekend activities! Adult Formation Class. For the next three Sundays, the second hour in the Memorial Room will be discussing Advent from a variety of perspectives. Today's class is titled *Watching and Waiting*, led by Grace VanderVliet. Advent is a time of waiting -- waiting for a special gathering of family or friends, waiting for gifts, waiting for Christmas Day. We can feel the build up. As Christians, we have been called to look for signs of God's presence around us as we wait. During this Second Hour session, we'll consider images of people waiting. We'll practice looking closely, we'll imagine, and we'll wonder together about God's reincarnation and what we're watching for in the meantime.

Sunday Young-Ish Adult Gathering.
